# **Pediatric Visiting Professorship**

The mission of the Rheumatology Research Foundation is to advance research and training to improve the health of people with rheumatic diseases

The purpose of the Pediatric Visiting Professorship is to support a 2-3 day pediatric rheumatology educational forum directed at clinicians and trainees involved in the care of children, and to provide pediatric rheumatology exposure to medical students, residents and fellows at institutions where there is no pediatric rheumatology program.

**Award Amount:** Each visiting professor will receive a \$2,000 honorarium, plus reimbursement of up to \$1,000 for travel expenses (including lodging, meals, airport parking and ground transportation).

# **Guidelines**

All award recipients must abide by Foundation Awards and Grants Policies at all times.

#### Eligibility

- The applicant must meet citizenship and other eligibility requirements as outlined in the Awards and Grants policies.
- The applicant must be a member of ACR
- > The applicant must be board certified in pediatric rheumatology
- > The applicant must have six or more years of experience in clinical pediatric rheumatology
- > The applicant must have an academic appointment and track record as a lecturer

Note: If you have participated in the Pediatric Visiting Professorship in the past, you do not need to apply again. #### **Award Terms and Funding**

The visiting professorship will last two to three days and should incorporate a variety of teaching formats, such as lectures, workshops, discussions or a combination of the above. Visits must occur within one calendar year. No extensions will be granted.

Each visiting professor will receive a \$2,000 honorarium. In addition, recipients will be reimbursed up to \$1,000 for travel expenses (including lodgings, meals, airport parking and ground transportation). Airfare will be paid by the Foundation and travel arrangements must be booked through the Foundation's preferred travel agency.

### **Personal Statement**

Limited to 1 page.

Please indicate your sub-specialty- if applicable- or areas of expertise and how your participation as a visiting professor will contribute to the goals of the program and be of benefit to your academic career.

### **Proposed Activities for Visit**

The list may include, but not be limited to the following:

- Physical exam workshop with child
- Clinic with pre-selected patients
- Luncheon with Residents and Fellows (career development discussion)

- Adult rheumatology grand rounds
- Arthritis Foundation chapter organized lecture
- Evening opportunities with Residents (e.g., dinner)
- Pediatric grand rounds
- Lecture(s)

### **Documentation of Experience**

Please provide documentation to verify at least six years of experience in pediatric rheumatology, such as a letter from your division chief or a statement outlining your experience specific to pediatric rheumatology.
