Fellowship Training Award for Workforce Expansion

The mission of the Rheumatology Research Foundation is to advance research and training to improve the health of people with rheumatic diseases.

The purpose of this workforce expansion award is to help ensure an adequate supply of rheumatology providers meeting the needs of children and adults with rheumatic diseases in all areas of the country, particularly those currently underserved. The *Fellowship Training Award for Workforce Expansion* may be used to support the salary of any fellow in an ACGME-accredited rheumatology fellowship training program meeting any of the criteria below:

- The program has been unable to fill all its ACGME-approved slots due to funding constraints,
- An existing program that is creating a new slot,
- A new ACGME-accredited program (prepared to participate in the NRMP match for the first year of funding)

Award Amount: \$50,000 per year (\$100,000 max adult programs, \$150,000 max for pediatric programs)

Award Duration: 2 years for adult training programs, 3 years for pediatric training programs

Guidelines

All award recipients must abide by Foundation Awards and Grants Policies at all times.

Eligibility

- The Fellowship Training Award for Workforce Expansion may be used to support the salary of any fellow in an ACGME-accredited rheumatology fellowship training program meeting any of the criteria below:
 - Program has been unable to fill all its ACGME-approved slots due to funding constraints,
 - An existing program that is creating a new slot,
 - A new ACGME-accredited program (prepared to participate in the NRMP match for the first year of funding)
- Applicant (Program Director) must be an ACR or ARP member at the time of submission and for the duration of the award.
- > Only Program Directors at ACGME-accredited institutions in good standing may apply.
- The rheumatology fellowship training Program Director at the institution will be responsible for the overall direction, management and administration of the program.
- > By submitting an application, the Program Director and sponsoring institution agree funds will be used for salary support of one fellow in their first or second year (or third year fellow in pediatric rheumatology). The name of the fellow supported during the grant period will be requested to be provided in your final award report.
- Multiple applications from a single institution will not be permitted unless they are for separate training programs (e.g. adult and pediatric rheumatology).
- Programs may not apply for the Fellowship Training Award and the Fellowship Training Award for Workforce Expansion within the same application cycle.
- The FTA WE and FTA are multi-year awards [two years for adult and three years for pediatric]. A program can only apply in a new award cycle, if the current award is complete, or in its final year.
- ➤ If there is no fellow available to appoint to this award between July 1, 2026, and June 30, 2027, the recipient may request a one-year deferral.
- ➤ There are no citizenship restrictions for supported fellows.

Review Criteria

Applications will be reviewed based on all components of the proposal, including:

- Program is filling a previously unfilled slot (due to funding constraint or creation of a new slot or program)
- Programs within a geographically underserved area
- Academic and/or clinical quality
- Success in achieving the goals of the training program
- Demonstrated financial need

All applications undergo rigorous peer review in their assigned study section and are scored and ranked according to the review criteria and overall merit of the proposal. All study section recommendations are sent to the Foundation's Scientific Advisory Council for review before being presented to the Foundation's Board of Directors for final approval.

Award Terms and Funding

This is a multi-year award. No trainee may be appointed for less than 12 months during the period of appointment. Upon receipt of this award, the institution will be asked to provide assurance that funds will be used to fill an ACGME-approved slot that has previously gone unfilled (due to funding constraint or creation of a new slot or program) and the funds will be allocated to salary support of one fellow. Funding will not be released until the Foundation receives these documents.

Recipients will receive \$50,000 per year to support the salary and fringe benefits of one trainee. The award is paid directly to the sponsoring institution in two equal installments in July and January as outlined below. Other trainee costs are to be incurred by the recipient's institutional program.

At the close of the award term, the recipient must provide the Foundation with a final financial reconciliation and the name of the fellow(s) supported during the duration of the award period. All unexpended funds must be returned to the Foundation.

Application Instructions

Before starting the online application, you will be required to create a Professional Profile in ProposalCentral, if you have not already. To do so, visit this link to begin creating your account.

All files must be saved as a PDF. Documents that do not have a required template should be formatted with ½ inch margin, 11-point Arial Font, and single-spacing (does not apply to figures and tables). All applications and documents must be written in English and avoid use of jargon. If terms are not universally known, spell out the term the first time it is used and note the appropriate abbreviation in parentheses. The acronym may be used thereafter.

Program Information

You will be asked to list the Institution name, program type (pediatric/adult), and confirm eligibility in this section. You will also be asked to indicate which years your institution has received a Rheumatology Research Foundation Fellowship Training Award or Fellowship Training Award for Workforce Expansion in the last 5 academic years.

Current & Pending Support

Applicants should list all current and pending financial support, including but not limited to grants and contracts. Indicate any current startup funds. For each entry, specify the overlap between the other awards, applications, and/or sources listed in this application.

Applicant/Program Director

You will be asked to provide contact information in this section, and to upload the **Program Director's biosketch** in NIH format (limited to 5 pages and should include any pending support).

 For each goal, please specify your success in achieving the goal. For example, if one is to ensure clinicians are well trained, cite your board pass rate; if another goal is to train physician scientists, cite how many graduates are still engaged in research.
- B. Description of program (limit 8,000 characters including spaces) including:
 - Program structure by training year (including number of outpatients clinics, inpatient consult times, electives, research, and training/participating institutions)
 - Curriculum; including didactics, journal clubs, board reviews, ultrasound training, QI experiences, etc.,)
 - Program's strengths: examples of what your program does best
 - Program's weaknesses: explain them and what you or the institution are doing to mitigate them
- C. Number of ACGME-approved training slots, number of slots entered into the NRMP match, fill rates for the past 5 years, and any plans for future growth/support (limit 1,500 characters including spaces)

- D. Evidence that you are in a geographically underserved area (limit 3,500 characters including spaces). Examples that may be referred to in this section include:
 - Proximity to next nearest training program
 - Number of practicing rheumatologists within a 50-mile radius, a ratio of providers to potential patients and/or wait times in your practice for a new patient visit
 - Catchment area, typical distance travelled by patients to see a rheumatologist
 - Reference to IDeA eligible states (A list generated via the NIH's Institutional Development Award)
 - Reference to <u>HRSA shortage areas</u> (A list generated by the Health Resources and Services Administration)
- E. Brief statement of financial need and the impact the award will have on the training program, as well as certification that the fellowship has an ACGME-approved slot that has gone unfilled due to lack of funding (if applicable) (limit 1,500 characters including spaces); there is no need to duplicate information here that you have included in the "fellowship positions questionnaire" application-included in the online application.)

Required Documents

Publications List

List publications that include rheumatology fellows among the authors within the last five years. Please bold each fellow's name in the author listing. Only include publications from work done primarily during the fellowship training (work originated or happened primarily as a fellow). Papers and abstracts should be separated. If applying as a new ACGME-accredited program, publications list may not be applicable.

Download, complete and submit the Faculty Information Table for all faculty members who will have significant interaction with the fellows. See an example of the table below.

Letter of Institutional Support

The division chief, department chair, or equivalent institutional official must provide written assurance of the following:

- The quality of the training program
- Clear support for the program, Program Director and trainees
- Means of funding remaining salary (how the remaining funding for the trainee will be covered in the award cycle)
