OUR MISSION

Advance research and training to improve the health of patients living with rheumatic diseases.

Purpose

There is an urgent need to expand the rheumatology workforce, including physicians, physician-scientists, research scientists and other professionals. As part of our Choose Rheumatology program, the Foundation encourages students and residents to explore a career in rheumatology. The purpose of this scholarship is to expose undergraduate students, or those in post-baccalaureate training, to rheumatology research and medicine by supporting their in-person attendance at the premier rheumatology meeting.

Recipients of the scholarship will have the ability to attend [ACR Convergence 2026](#), the world's premier rheumatology experience. Participation at this meeting will introduce recipients to the specialty of rheumatology and rheumatology-related health care in order to better serve patients with rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases. Awardees will be invited to attend several invite-only networking and learning opportunities with other students and residents, as well as leaders in the rheumatology community. This includes:

- Invitation to the Foundation's award recipient's luncheon
- Attendance at an exclusive half-day Choose Rheumatology Experience (see below)

Award Amount

\$2,000 for travel expenses, complimentary registration to ACR Convergence 2026, plus a one-year [ACR/ARP Membership](#).

ACR Convergence (November 6-11 in Orlando, FL.)

The meeting features the latest innovations, science, clinical and business best practices in rheumatology. Attendees will get first-hand access to the latest discoveries and research that are transforming rheumatic disease care, as well as clinical applications that can improve the health of patients. It is an opportunity to experience personalized learning and networking that allows attendees to expand their knowledge and to develop new areas of interest and focus within rheumatology. Award Eligibility and Guidelines

All award recipients must abide by Foundation [Awards and Grants Policies](#) at all times.

Eligibility

- The applicant must be a currently enrolled graduate student; medical student; or internal medicine, pediatric, or combined medicine/pediatrics resident at a U.S. based institution.
- Previous recipients of this award are not eligible to apply.

Award Terms and Funding

This is a one-year award and awardees will receive the following:

- \$2,000 award for travel expenses to attend ACR Convergence 2026
- Complimentary* registration to ACR Convergence 2026
- One-year [ACR/ARP membership](#)
- Attendance at the *Choose Rheumatology* Experience

***ACR membership is required to receive complimentary registration to attend the ACR Convergence. Membership is free to all student and resident awardees. Join ACR online at [ACR Membership](#).**

Attendance at ACR Convergence 2026 is required, or award funds must be returned to the Foundation within 30 days.

Based on federal tax guidelines, individuals receiving an award or grant of at least \$600 will receive a [Form 1099-MISC](#) for the calendar year in which payment was disbursed. Submission of travel receipts totaling the amount of \$2,000 post Convergence will eliminate the need to issue a 1099 tax form.

Application Instructions

Before starting the online application, you will be required to create a Professional Profile account in Proposal Central to begin creating your account [at this link](#).

All files must be saved as a PDF. Documents that do not have a required template should be formatted with ½ inch margins, 11-point Arial Font, and single-spacing (does not apply to figures and tables). All applications and documents must be written in English and avoid use of jargon. If terms are not universally known, spell out the term the first time it is used and note the appropriate abbreviation in parentheses. The acronym may be used thereafter.

Note: The Foundation does not require an official signature from an authorized institutional research office at the time of application. However, many institutions require an application to be reviewed prior to submission. Please check with your research office for your institution's requirements.

Applicant Biosketch

You will be asked to confirm your eligibility and provide contact information in this section. In addition to the applicant information requested, you will be asked to upload the following documents:

Applicant Biosketch

Applicant must submit a Biographical Sketch using the provided template. A [SciENCv-generated biosketch](#) will also be accepted. The biosketch is limited to five (5) pages, regardless of format.

Statement of Need (Limit 1 page)

The applicant must include the following:

- Description of current career plans and interest in rheumatology
- Explanation of why this award is needed

Letter of Recommendation (Limit 1 page)

Letter of recommendation from a faculty member, or current mentor, from the applicant's institution confirming their enrollment at the institution and availability to attend ACR Convergence, as well as the Choose Rheumatology Experience.
